Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth.


I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord, and You forgave the iniquity of my sin.

The Holy Gospel according to St. John, the fifteenth chapter.





As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. ⁵ I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing. ⁶ If anyone does not abide in me he is thrown away like a branch and withers; and the branches are gathered, thrown into the

John 15:2 – "Every branch of mine that does not bear fruit he takes away, and every branch that does bear fruit he prunes, that it may bear more fruit."

God is interested in the fruit that we bear in good works, and He even prunes us so that we may bring forth more fruit. Trusting in our Lord's work for us, being grafted by grace into His vine, we desire to be more like Him, to grow into His image. That's growth in fruit bearing — and it always comes with some pruning.

+ The Lord's Supper +

The Lord's Supper, also called Communion, The Eucharist, the Lord's Table, the Sacrament of the Altar, is a miraculous event, given by Jesus to us for the strengthening of our faith and the forgiveness of our sins (Matthew 26:26).

The Eucharist is the holiest thing on Earth. It is like fire: without repentance and faith, you receive it to your harm; with repentance and faith, it is the medicine of immortality (I Corinthians 10 & 11).

We invite all baptized and repentant Christians, who believe in Jesus Christ as their Savior, desire forgiveness of their sins, and believe that the very body and blood of Christ are truly present in, with, and under the bread and wine to receive the Lord's Supper with us. However, please speak with Pastor Zech or Pastor Ben before communing here at St. Paul's, because in accordance with the apostolic command and in unity with the unbroken practice of the Church, we practice Closed Communion. We kindly ask you to refrain from communing until we understand that you seek to be unified with us in our teaching.

We do so not to offend you, but because the Scriptures clearly teach that those communing together be unified in their confession of the Faith. In this Sacrament we are not only joined to Christ our Head who is present in His body and blood, but are also knit together with one another as His Body, in which there should be no division of belief.

If you are a fellow Christian, but do not share our confession of faith (as stated above), please pray for the unity of the church, and please feel free to come to the altar of the Lord for a blessing (please communicate this by folding your arms).







